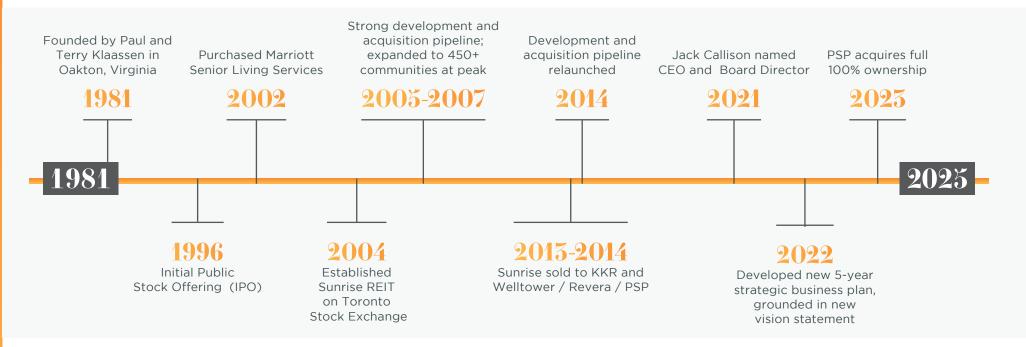

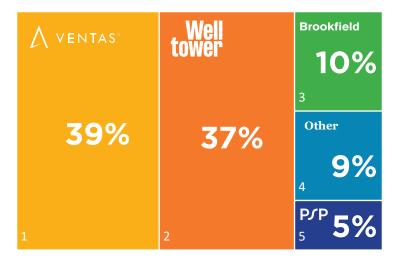

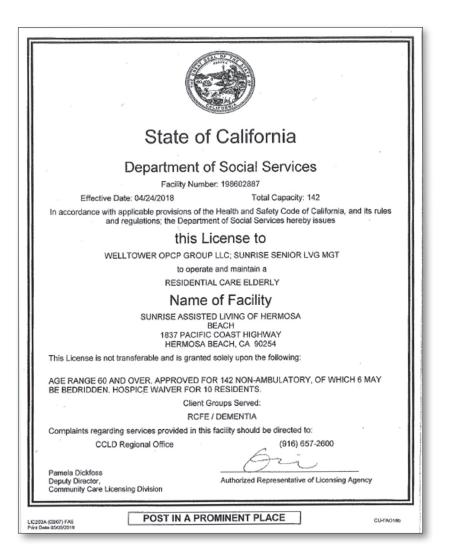

Located at 10354 Wilshire Boulevard on a ground lease, the project will transform a currently vacant 40-unit apartment building into a 20-story, full-service senior living community. The development will include 178 senior residences, comprising 100 ultra-luxury independent living units, 48 assisted living units, and 30 memory care units. An adjacent 4-story building at 10341 Ashton Avenue will provide 36 income-restricted apartments, reinforcing the project's commitment to both luxury and affordability.



A defining feature of this initiative is the co-GP partnership between Sunrise Senior Living and Lincoln Property Company (LPC). Over the past two years, Sunrise and LPC have cultivated a strategic relationship to co-develop senior housing projects across key markets. LPC, one of the largest privately held real estate firms in the U.S., brings deep development expertise and a national footprint, managing over 489 million square feet of real estate and having developed more than \$22 billion in commercial projects in the past five years.

This collaboration allows Sunrise to leverage LPC's capital strength and development infrastructure while maintaining its leadership in senior care operations. 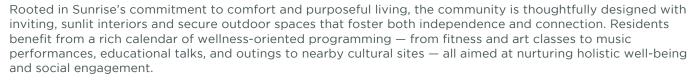

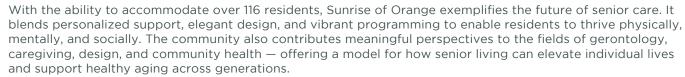

The thoughtfully designed property supports over 200 residents across three care levels, with spacious apartments, well-appointed common areas, and secure outdoor courtyards. Interior spaces reflect warmth and comfort, blending natural Colorado-inspired aesthetics with Sunrise's signature hospitality.

Residents benefit from robust wellness offerings that promote independence and vitality, including daily exercise classes, local excursions, educational seminars, and intergenerational programs. Onsite amenities include a restaurant-style dining room, casual bistro, salon, fitness center, and activity studios that support both cognitive and physical engagement.

The dining program is a cornerstone of community life, offering fresh, chef-prepared meals tailored to individual preferences and dietary needs. With an emphasis on nutrition, taste, and social dining, the culinary team delivers meals that nourish body and spirit alike.

Operationally, Sunrise at Flatirons continues to perform with strong occupancy and rate metrics.

Its enduring success showcases the value of integrated care, purpose-driven design, and lifestyle programming in elevating the aging experience.

Proposed Use Types

The proposed development will offer a full continuum of senior living care, with 200+ units of Independent Living (IL), Assisted Living (AL), and Memory Care (MC), thoughtfully designed in accordance with California healthcare regulations and licensure standards. All licensed components will meet Residential Care Facility for the Elderly (RCFE) requirements and will emphasize a non-institutional, wellness-focused residential model that supports resident autonomy and dignity.

This use is consistent with BCHD's rights and obligations as a California healthcare district.

Planning/Design Approach

The architectural strategy centers on a campus-style layout that emphasizes connectivity, daylight access, and biophilic principles. Buildings are arranged to preserve key view corridors and maximize natural ventilation. Landscaped courtyards and walkable internal streets link residential, wellness, and amenity zones.

Illustrative site plans highlight key design elements, such as:

- A central wellness spine with direct pedestrian access
- Outdoor terraces and roof gardens programmed for social engagement



Planning/Design Approach

The project will include two 5-story buildings for IL and AL/MC use, plus 1-story duplex cottages. A porte cochère marks the formal entry, preserving medical office structures and a parking facility. Renderings reflect a modern architectural expression with warm materials and landscaped edges.

The plan also introduces a welcoming entry experience at the Assisted Living/Memory Care (AL/MC) building, with a thoughtfully designed and

inviting approach. This entry sequence is intended to create a sense of arrival that is warm, dignified, and accessible for residents and visitors alike. Toward the rear of the site, the Independent Living (IL) component forms a vibrant residential hub, anchored by a circular vehicular drive that enhances convenience, circulation, and access while promoting a village-like atmosphere.



Blue Zones and Sustainability Alignment

Blue Zones principles into the planning and design of our communities to promote longevity, purpose, and holistic well-being. Integration of Blue Zones Principles. This includes creating walkable site plans that encourage daily movement, incorporating nature and outdoor spaces to support relaxation and connection, and designing with social engagement in mind through communal dining and flexible gathering spaces.

Sustainability is a core consideration in Sunrise's development approach, shaping decisions from early design through long-term operations. We prioritize strategies that reduce environmental impact, enhance energy efficiency, and promote resident well-being, such as optimizing building orientation for natural light, integrating high-performance systems, and selecting low-impact materials. Where feasible, we target certifications like LEED and/or WELL and collaborate closely with consultants to meet or exceed local sustainability mandates. Our operational model reinforces these commitments through waste reduction, water conservation, and ongoing performance monitoring, ensuring our communities remain environmentally responsible and resilient over time.









Conceptual Financing Structure

Historically, Sunrise has anticipated a 65-75% debt structure on development projects.

The remaining 25–35% of project capital is generally funded through a combination of General Partner (GP) and Limited Partner (LP) equity. Sunrise, as the General Partner, will fund pre-development costs and will commit to funding the required GP equity and sourcing the required LP equity. With a longstanding track record and strong relationships across a broad network of capital partners, the team has successfully led numerous senior housing developments nationwide.

Bond Financing

Alternatively, the development team has also successfully employed **tax-exempt bond financing**, which involves selling bonds to finance up to 100% of the project cost, thereby eliminating the need for traditional equity in those cases.

Sunrise remains actively engaged with tax-exempt bond partners. Recently, the company raised \$131.2 million for its Manhattan Beach project, which began construction in February 2025, and raised \$80M for its Long Beach project which will begin construction in August 2025. Sunrise is also actively pursuing bond financing for additional projects in its development pipeline.

For this project, Sunrise is well-positioned to adapt to evolving economic conditions. The team can strategically adjust its approach by modifying leverage levels, utilizing tax-exempt financing vehicles, or prioritizing equity fundraising efforts that align with investor preferences and interest rate trends.

Sunrise has maintained a robust development pipeline even during periods of market disruption, including the post-COVID recovery, demonstrating both financial discipline and strategic agility.

Revenue Sharing Strategy

Sunrise remains open to the possibility of a revenue-sharing arrangement; however, the final structure and viability will be assessed during the RFP phase.

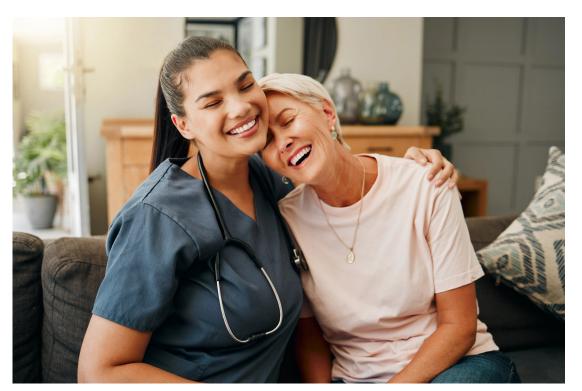
