Beach Cities Health District (BCHD) has served the people who live and work in Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach and Redondo Beach since 1955. Today, BCHD offers more than 40 community health programs and services that promote wellness and prevent diseases across the lifespan – from pre-natal and children to families and older adults.

Since May 2017, BCHD has held more than 60 meetings drawing more than 1,000 comments regarding ways to redevelop its property. The result is a comprehensive campus redevelopment Master Plan that is driven by BCHD’s collaborative approach.

# Comprehensive Master Plan Approach

BCHD is in the process of transforming our Redondo Beach property into a modernized Healthy Living Campus, an intergenerational hub that focuses on wellness, prevention and medical research for current and future Beach Cities generations.



## The Master Plan includes:

- A landmark Community Wellness Pavilion with a public presentation hall, indoor and outdoor public meeting spaces, a demonstration kitchen, experiential learning center, Blue Zones café and much more
- State-of-the-art, environmentally sustainable buildings/facilities and grounds
- Active green space to replace acres of asphalt
- Residential Care for the Elderly with approximately 420 units, and an enhanced child development center
- Intergenerational programs for all ages
- Modernized Center for Health & Fitness, including a warm water therapy pool
- Reduced building heights with green rooftops. (Building heights lowered from seven stories in original site plan to four levels in master plan)
- Increased focus on traffic mitigation. (Projections indicate a substantial reduction in vehicle trips compared to current campus)
- Green buffers between the campus and surrounding neighborhood
- Improved connectivity to the local community and city park, including a bike and pedestrian path

## Why Residential Care For the Elderly?

In keeping with BCHD's mission, a portion of the Healthy Living Campus will provide a continuum of residential care for aging members of the Beach Cities. Providing this essential health service onsite will allow residents to immerse themselves in a vibrant, intergenerational campus and remain physically and socially connected to our community as they age.
